## DIPLOMA TO DEGREE TRANSFER STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

Humber awards degree scholarships to students entering any Humber honours bachelor's degree program who have completed a two- or three-year diploma from a publidy funded college. Students who have achieved a program GPA of $80 \%$ or better will be awarded a one-time scholarship of $\$ 2,500$. Diplomas do not have to be related to the degree program of choice and are not tied to the eligibilitity for advanced standing or transfer credilt.
